

New award encourages medical students to choose family medicine

A \$1.2-million gift from the Walker Wood Foundation will create a significant new award for Dalhousie medical students who pursue a residency in rural family medicine.

Starting in 2024, two graduating MD students will each receive a James Walker Wood, MD, Award in Medicine valued at \$100,000 – the largest individual prize for MD graduates at Dal's Faculty of Medicine. Recipients must be entering a Family Medicine Residency at Dalhousie in a rural or remote area in the Maritimes.

Dalhousie places 7th in 2024 MacLean's University rankings of Canada's best medical doctoral universities

Dalhousie has maintained its seventh-place standing in *Maclean's* ranking of Canada's best Medical Doctoral <u>universities</u>.

Among the 15 universities ranked in this category, Dal is tied for seventh place with the University of Calgary. McGill University, the University of Toronto and the University of British Columbia once again placed in the top three spots in the category.

Within each category, *Maclean's* ranks universities based on 12 performance indicators with varying weighting. This year, Dalhousie placed in the top five among its cohort for six indicators — twice that of last year. The university placed third for the percentage of budget devoted to funding scholarships and bursaries. Dal placed fourth for student/faculty ratio, for the number of students who win national awards, for the number of faculty who win major awards, and for the amount of money in the operating budget per full-time-equivalent student. The percentage of budget allocated to library services earned Dalhousie a fifth-place rank.

National perspective

Canada's most-referenced domestic university ranking, <u>Maclean's University Rankings</u> have been an annual feature in the current affairs magazine since 1991. The ranking separates the 50 participating Canadian universities into three categories: Medical Doctoral, Comprehensive and Primarily Undergraduate. Dalhousie's competes in the Medical Doctoral category as one of the 15 Canadian universities that provide a broad range of PhD programs, focus on research depth, and include medical schools.
